Moving vehicles resulting in pedestrian injury	All participants	Vehicle movement to be controlled by marshalls Signage about participants and speed in place Car parking separate from event field	
Slips, trips and falls	All participants and spectators	Briefing for all participants and spectators using a PA system about site safety	
Cycle accident	Young people	Proposed tracks inspected and cleared prior to use Tracks to be marked with tape and signage Spectators kept separate from cyclists Marshalls stationed around the tracks in Hi-vis and with radios Parents and team leaders to check bikes and helmets prior to racing Cyclists briefed about what to do in the event of an accident Marshalls briefed about what to do in the event of an accident First aid provided by team leaders present and organising team Cyclists provided with a 'route walk' before racing starts

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Wet weather	All participants and spectators	Assessment of site prior to starting set up Ongoing assessment if weather deteriorates significantly	
General public access to the site via public footpath	All participants, spectators and the general public	Public footpath to be outside of track areas Members of the public entering the site to be monitored by marshalls and asked to remain on footpath route	
Lost children	All participants	Participants to remain on the event field unless accompanied by a parent or team leader Participants briefed about remaining on the event field and where to go (marquee) if lost	
Covid-19	All participants and spectators	Government regulations and guidelines in place at the time to be followed	

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
